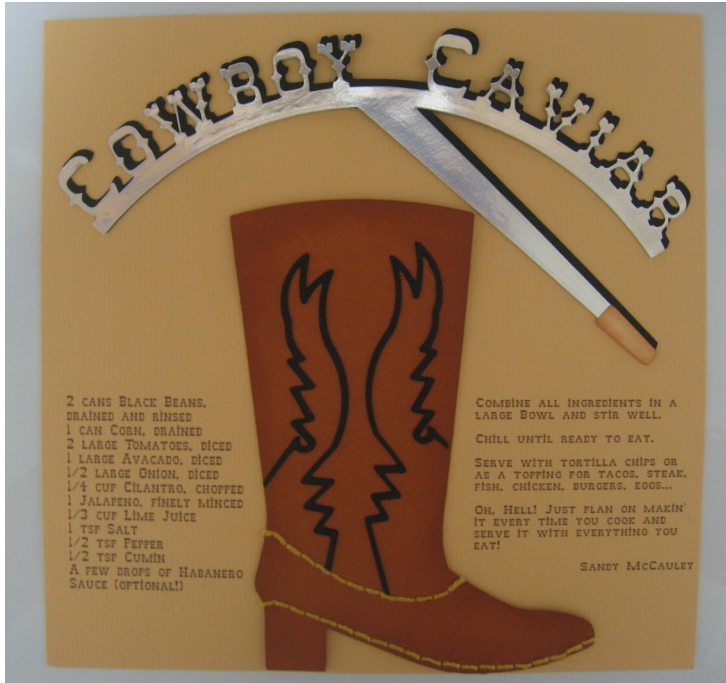


Cowboy Caviar Recipe Layout

Instructions and Terms of Use

- The TTF font I used for creating the welded title and typing the recipe is called Abilene Regular. You can download it here: <http://www.font-zone.com/>
- The branding iron was cut from mirrored cardstock. The rest of the die cuts were cut from regular cardstock.
- The “sewing” detail is provided in two forms: as a dashed line to cut or draw, as well as small circles to cut if you want to stitch those details as I did in my layout. If you are using the .KNK version then the outlines on the boot are provided as a pounced line for dashed line cutting or drawing. If you are using the PDF version then the line have already been split into dashed lines for cutting.
- If you plan to cut the circles for hand-stitching, I recommend doing a test cut on scrap cardstock first to see if the circle size works well with your embroidery needle. You want the circles to be just slightly smaller than the needle so that the needle and used as a guide for punching the needle through the cardstock. If they are too large, then the holes will be visible and the stitching will not look as nice. The hole size I chose was 1.75mm or 0.07”. You may need to go down to 1.5 mm (0.06”) or as high as 2.5mm (0.1”).

Cowboy Caviar

2 cans Black Beans,
drained and rinsed
1 can Corn, drained
2 large Tomatoes, diced
1 large Avocado, diced
1/2 large Onion, diced
1/4 cup Cilantro, chopped
1 Jalapeno, finely minced
1/3 cup Lime Juice
1 tsp Salt
1/2 tsp Pepper
1/2 tsp Cumin
A few drops of Habanero Sauce (optional!)

Combine all ingredients in a large Bowl and stir well.

Chill until ready to eat.

Serve with tortilla chips or as a topping for tacos, steak, fish, chicken, hamburgers, and eggs.
